DID YOU KNOW? Trees take in greenhouse gases. Trees and shrubs are unique in that they have a woody stem and roots that get bigger each year. The wood is mainly made of carbon from carbon dioxide, so it provides good, long-term storage for carbon that might otherwise go into the atmosphere. Protecting and watering trees as they grow will insure that they survive to their most productive years of carbon storage. **Earth Stewards**, FPC's environmental interest group, has gathered more information on trees' role in protecting our environment.
